The City of Dauphin requires a one-time (lifetime) license for all dogs and cats over 16 weeks old. Fees (subject to change)

Radon

Dauphin and the surrounding area have been identified as having high levels of radon, so it is very important that you get your home tested to protect your family's health. Radon is an invisible, odourless, radioactive gas that comes from the breakdown of uranium in the soil and enters homes through cracks in the foundation, gaps around pipes, and other small openings. Radon levels can vary from home to home, even within the same neighbourhood, and testing is the only way to know if you are at risk. More than 3,000 Canadians die each year from radon-induced lung cancer, so please take action to reduce the radon levels in your home. Testing is easy, and mitigation is very effective at significantly reducing your radon exposure. For more details on how to protect yourself from radon, visit https://dauphin.ca/p/radon.

RECREATION

Credit Union Place is Dauphin's premier recreation and event facility, featuring an NHL-sized arena that hosts Dauphin Kings hockey games, public skating, and special events. The facility also includes an indoor walking track and multi-purpose rooms available for community programs, meetings, and private rentals.



Located at the north end of Mountain Road. Meadowlark Park features a 1 km lit walking trail, picnic tables, benches, and a washroom facility. The park includes a nature-themed toddler playground and newly constructed basketball, tennis, and pickleball courts as part of the Multi-Use Community Court. It also has two beach volleyball courts for summer recreation.



The Kin Aquatic Centre is a year-round indoor pool offering both leisure and lane swimming. The facility features a large pool, water slide, and hot tub, with opportunities for swimming lessons, aquafit classes, public swims, and private rentals.



Located near Credit Union Place and the Kin Aquatic Centre, Maamawi Park is named after the Ojibwe word for "together." Once completed, Maamawi Park will feature a four-season toboggan hill with a summer slide, a pump track, a walking track, a memorial pond, and nature-inspired structures, all celebrating Indigenous heritage within the community.

WINTERTIPS PREPARING FOR WINTER

Winter in Manitoba can be a beautiful but challenging season, especially for those new to the region. Here are some tips to help you get ready:

- Invest in Warm Clothing: A good-quality winter coat, insulated • boots, gloves, and a toque are essential for staying warm.
- Layer Up: Wear multiple layers of clothing to trap heat and adjust • easily to indoor and outdoor temperatures.
- Winterize Your Home: Check windows and doors for drafts, and consider using weather stripping to keep the cold out. Ensure your heating system is in good working order.
- Get Snow-Ready: Equip yourself with a snow shovel or snow blower. ٠ Ice melt for sidewalks is also a good idea to prevent slipping.
- Prepare Your Vehicle: Install winter tires, keep an emergency kit in your car, and ensure your battery and antifreeze levels are checked.
- Stay Active: Join local winter sports or activities, like skating or snowshoeing, to stay active and enjoy the season.
- Learn About Winter Driving: Take extra care on icy roads, drive • slowly, and keep a safe distance from other vehicles.
- Keep a Winter Emergency Kit: Have essentials like blankets, non-٠ perishable food, water, and a flashlight in case of a power outage or getting stranded.


