Please see the following additional information regarding the envisioned patrol area:

The primary geographical scope of the patrols would generally focus on the downtown core, primarily Main Street and the surrounding area. More specifically, the anticipated patrol area would include Main Street from approximately 5th Avenue South northward to River Avenue, with the patrol zone generally extending west to 2nd Street and east to Mountain Road.

In addition to the downtown core, the patrol model is also expected to include patrols of City parks and public spaces. Primary attention would be focused on Vermillion Park (including the campground area) and CN Park. Secondary patrol areas would include Meadowlark Park, Gartmore Park, Pioneer Park, Maamawi Park, and the Berry Patch.

Based on current community concerns and observed activity patterns, some of the key hotspot areas include:

- The 2nd Avenue NW corridor (planned Craft District area), including the area surrounding the Safe Warm Space and CN Station;
- The area in and around the Dauphin Public Library;
- The area in and around the Dauphin Recreation Complex;
- the area around Parkview Lodge; and
- Downtown bumpout seating areas and benches, particularly the location across from RBC, which has generated recurring concerns.

The City anticipates that patrol deployment and attention levels may evolve throughout the pilot period based on operational experience, community feedback, seasonal activity patterns, and emerging needs.
