WHEREAS on April 28th Canada will observe the National Day of Mourning, which commemorates workers who have been killed, injured, or suffered illness due to workplace hazards and incidents;

AND WHEREAS in December 1990, Parliament passed the “*Workers Mourning Day*” Act, and April 28th was officially recognized as a National Day of Mourning;

AND WHEREAS since its inception, the observance has spread to over 80 countries around the world commonly referred to as Workers Memorial Day;

AND WHEREAS workers and employees observe this day in various ways, including lighting candles, donning ribbons, wearing black armbands, and observing moments of silence;

AND WHEREAS the purpose of the National Day of Mourning is to remember and honour those lives lost or injured and to renew the commitment to improve health and safety in the workplace to prevent further deaths, injuries, and diseases from work;
